Preparations for arriving in Yaoundé, Cameroon

We have been awed by how God is bringing together all the various pieces for our leaving to go to Cameroon. Here's what has been going on in the past three months:

- Purchased **plane tickets** for Yaoundé, Cameroon, leaving July 8th, 7 PM from Dulles International, changing planes in Paris. Total flight time—16+ hours.
- Applications, photos and waiting in line to obtain **passports** for everyone.
- Gotten about **seven shots** each (Tetanus, Yellow Fever, Meningococcal, Hepatitis A and B, Polio, and Typhoid.)
- God provided a family with 2 children to **rent our house** while we are gone.
- People gave very generous support to cover all of our costs for tickets and passports.
- **Three teachers** are planning to come teach at the new elementary school in Cameroon so Wendy won't be home schooling David and Elizabeth.
- Two different retired couples here at JAARS have generously offered to take care of our cat and dog for the year we are gone! Our God is so gracious.



Thank you all for your prayers. We praise God for all He has done.

As the countdown to departure continues, here is what is left to do:

- Apply for our visas for Cameroon.
- Pack up all closets, drawers, cupboards and wall hangings to store in our attic.
- Pack eight suitcases for the flight over.
- All those things we didn't realize we needed to do ©

Some facts about SIL¹ in Cameroon.

- In 2005, SIL had some type of involvement in over 80 Bible translation projects in Cameroon.
- In 2005, 332 different Cameroonians and other Africans from 72 languages took part in regional and national level training in linguistics, translation and literacy held by SIL in Cameroon.
- There are about 270 different languages in Cameroon. The only African nation to have more languages is Nigeria.
- There are 38 completed New Testaments and 13 completed Bibles.
- It is estimated there are about 90 language projects still needing to be started.
